




In the meanwhile, after a survey conducted to the project students as well as to their families, we got the results of the projects impact on them. Have a look!!!


2. Were the activities during the first year organized to achieve the project goals?


The majority of the respondents found that the project achieved its goals

4. What are the aspects from the final products that you consider most relevant for learning about and applying a healthy lifestyle?



5. What aspects from the campaigns, "A Healthy Eating Week" and 'A Day of Sports', do you consider that are important?



6. Through my participation in these project activities, I improved:



Most of the participants improved their respect and understanding of other countries and their communicative skills in English.

7. To what extent did the project activities correspond to the youngsters' needs for a better personal and professional life?

The respondents found that the project activities corresponded quite a lot to their needs for a better personal and professional life while a great amount of them answered that it corresponded to a great extent.

To the question "How do you intend to use in the future the experience you gained through the project activities?" most of the students answered that they were motivated to adopt a healthy lifestyle. All of them, however, admitted that they will got profits from the project in developing their social life as they learned how to collaborate, communicate and respect other cultures. They also learned to be tolerant towards differentiation and avoid racism

To the question "What could your school / community benefit from participating in this project?" most of the students replied that it was an unforgettable experience that taught them how to communicate with peers from different countries and cultures, improved their English and ICT skills and developed tolerance and respect to differentiation. All these will be of great importance for our school to avoid incidents of racism, become more international and more "famous" for the projects it takes part that help its students improve themselves and make it improve its level

To the question "Will you take part, if possible, in the activities of another Erasmus+ project?" all students replied positively as they consider it a creative and effective way to gain knowledge, experience, develop social skills, teamwork, tolerance and respect of other people and cultures, improve language and ICT skills.
